*Over 100 kids give their lives to Christ in Keta, Ghana during Summer Camp*

Summer Camp 2012 in Ghana was a huge success! The one-week camp aimed to bring together children and teens, ages 10 to 17, from very deprived communities to truly experience the love of Christ and, in turn, take His love back to their homes and neighborhoods. Pastor Paul and Angie Doe ministered to an average of 500 children each day. Smaller children as well as adults also wanted to be part of camp, where they received lots of love. 150 boys and girls were bussed in from different areas of the country; a 5-hour ride brought in the farthest group from the Eastern region of Ghana into Keta, where the camp was held.

The event targeted mostly unsaved children, possibly being the greatest exposure to the Gospel that many ever had.

Each day, services and activities embraced the theme, "That They May Know Christ and Make Him Known to Their World."

The success of the camp was measured by 100 salvations and even more rededications along with baptisms in the Holy Spirit, deliverances and words of prophecy. On Friday, all those who were saved were baptized in water as they professed death to the old creation and life in Christ being made new. The camp was concluded that night with a testimony service and bonfire.

Besides catering to the spiritual needs of the children, the camp organizers put together soccer and volleyball tournaments, high jump competitions and relay races. The youth gave it their all and by the grace of God all were housed, fed, taught and equipped for eternity.

CMI ministers Liber Murieda of Uruguay and Eduardo Delgado of Bolivia joined in an evangelistic effort last month. The intense miracle campaign by both ministers produced tremendous fruit; the hand of God healed intestinal diseases, foot problems and many other illnesses.
