A note from Rev. Doe:

We at the CALEB Centers Africa are very thankful for a wonderful year 2009. Over the past year we have seen the faithfulness of God in many diverse ways. Over the course of the year we have continued to

reach hundreds of children in different parts of Ghana through our educational assistance, sports programs, Bible studies and feeding programs.

OUTREACH PROGRAMS

Thrice in 2009 we organized special outreach programs under our "Smile Africa" project to some deprived communities through which we were able to bless over 3,000 kids. During the special outreaches we taught the kids using the Book of Hope, provided horse rides, fun games and feeding.

In the month of December we held two Christmas Projects in two different communities bringing the love of the season to over 1000 kids.

Our goal is to educate and to safeguard at-risk and abused children, to free them from spiritual bondage, ease poverty conditions and equip them to become responsible Christians and future contributing members of society.





RESTORATION CAMPS IN HAITI

Haiti was shaken and crumbling on January 12. The world immediately responded in relief and rescue efforts -- the Body of Christ responded as well.

Before heading into Haiti, Pastor Mark Boykin immediately went into meetings to move forward in the setting up of infrastructure in way of "Restoration Camps" in different parts of Haiti to help begin the process for Haitians to get their lives back. A small group went into Haiti on Friday, Jan 22 to Jemani, and then on to Port-au-Prince.

CMI is working closely with the National Social Service Evangelical Council, the National Evangelical University in the DR, as well as Pastor Israel Brito and Pastor Victor Medina, working on behalf of CMI on Hispaniola. Plans are to ship items via Dominican Republic and then drive supplies into Haiti.

We have received reports that most of our CMI ministers in Haiti are alive. Sadly, we have lost 4, with several injured from minor to severe. Many of their homes are completely destroyed. Pastor Roosevelt Brutus is asking for immediate assistance in order to help the many ministers and their families.
